A Letter from Fr. Humke

Dear Friends at St. Mark's Church:

Here we are heading off into the New Year already. I don't know whether it is a product of my age or of the times in which we live, but I can't seem to keep up with the speed by which time goes by these days. It seems as if one moment it's July 4 and the next moment it's New Year's Day.

And what's more, Lent is just around the corner this year. Did you know that Easter this year is only one day short of being the earliest Easter that can ever be? That means, of course, that Ash Wednesday

comes early as well, and this year Ash Wednesday, when Lent begins, is February 6.

Let me tell you something about the date of Easter. It sounds difficult to understand, but it really isn't. Easter Day is always the Sunday after the first full moon that occurs on or after March 21. So Easter falls between March 22 and April 25. In other words, it can be at the end of winter or in the week before Derby.

This year Easter comes on March 23, and it hasn't been that early since 1913. It won't be that early again in this century. You can find all that sort of information in the Prayer Book, beginning on p.880. So the next time the sermon seems interminable to you, browse through those pages in the Prayer Book. They really are quite interesting.

Something else about Easter: how to set the date of Easter was one of the things that Christians fought over for many, many years. They reviled one another. They split to form their own churches. They stopped speaking to one another. They condemned those who thought differently from them. In other words, they acted just as Christians are acting today over the matter of sexuality. I, for one, am glad that our controversy is the more substantive one of the intrinsic worth of each person, despite his or her sexual orientation, than it is over a date in the calendar.

Lent is a season for spending more intentional time in the presence of God. We will be suggesting some ways in which you might do this, so look in your Sunday bulletins this month for suggestions. Begin to make plans now to keep a good Lent.

Vestry Bios

Alice Shaw Covell

Raised in a minister's family, Alice is a "pre-cradle Episcopalian." Much of her early life in Virginia and North Carolina was spent in support of her family's life commitment to the church. This meant involvement in Sunday School, the Junior Choir, the Junior Altar Guild, Youth Fellowship, countless pot-luck suppers with preps and clean-ups, lots of leadership roles in youth services and pageants, ongoing Christian education—all with the main focus of furthering God's purpose through education and working with people. As a teenager, Alice went to one of the Virginia Episcopal schools, St. Margaret's, where again, Christian education with service in the church and the community were an ongoing part of life. Summers were spent as a camp counselor at Kanuga, Shrine Mount, and Roslyn, until it became clear that teaching was her ambition. She then opted for summer education courses at William and Mary to supplement her studies at Randolph-Macon Women's College and later the University of Louisville.

Life in a minister's family was wonderful preparation for Alice's thirty-five years of teaching at St. Francis in Goshen. The education and wellbeing of children has been a central interest and joy in her life, along with the raising of her two children, Michael and Monica Mahoney. Throughout this ministry, the faith and support of the church community have been a strong and constant blessing. St. Mark's was important in the early life of her family, so for her, it was a

particularly happy reunion with this parish when Alice moved back to Crescent Hill.

Since retirement from teaching, Alice has remained active in the day-to-day care and education of her two young grandchildren, Lorenzo and Monica. Since they both go to St. Francis pre-school and Alice's son is at Goshen campus as a middle school history teacher, ties remain strong with St. Francis School. Still, there is time for Alice to learn and grow in the knowledge and love of God through her studies in the Education for Ministry, where she is now in her fourth year. Alice is also currently serving St. Mark's as a Lay Eucharistic Visitor, a member of the Altar Guild, and a deliverer of altar flowers. In the community, Alice's activities revolve around the Crescent Hill Garden Club, the University of Louisville Women's Club, the Speed Art Museum, the Filson Club, and Farmington's Education Committee. Her interests are education, entertaining, gardening, architecture, art, history, and travel.

O God, you have made of one blood all the peoples of the earth,
and sent your blessed Son to preach peace to those who are far
off and to those who are near: Grant that people everywhere may
seek after you and find you; bring the nations into your fold;
pour out your Spirit upon all flesh; and hasten the coming
of your kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
