Lent at St. Mark's

Wednesday Evenings at St. Mark's

Many persons like to take upon themselves a new spiritual discipline during the season of Lent as a way of preparing for Easter. To that end, St. Mark's offers a special program on Wednesday evenings during Lent. The evening has three components: a simple shared meal; an educational opportunity; and a concluding time of worship.

Lenten Education Series 2007

This year's theme is "Lent...A Time for Spiritual Exploration". The Education for Ministry classes at St. Mark's are preparing a Sabbath Center which will remain in place throughout Lent and will be comprised of various stations in the Dreher Room as well as the Parlor. The Sabbath Center is a place set apart to experience and experiment with ancient spiritual practices, and it also contains contemporary resources for spiritual exploration and encounters with God.

Each of us has unique abilities, interests and preferences. The Center is designed to have something for everyone. The exercises and practices you will experience take time and are best if not rushed. Don't attempt to visit all stations in one evening. Choose one or two different things to do each Wednesday. Some examples of what you will find in the Sabbath Center are:

- Scents and Savor – Experience tastes and aromas that awaken us to God
- Sights and Sounds – Listen to a variety of recordings of chant, Taize and music for prayer
- Prayer Wall – Read and post your own prayers and petitions on the prayer wall
- Watercolor Painting – Express your faith through colors and images
- Spiritual Journals – Record your various encounters with God as you reflect on your unique spiritual journey
- Contemplative Prayer – Learn to focus on who God is as you meditate on simple phrases, words or images of God

Holy Week, beginning on Palm Sunday and culminating in the great Festival of the Resurrection, Easter Day, is the center of the Church Year for Christians. Consequently, the liturgies used during that week are distinctive to the season itself and are not used at other times during the year.

On Palm Sunday, April 1, our 8:00 a.m. Eucharist will be no different from other Sundays except that palms will be blessed and distributed. At the 10:00 a.m. Eucharist, however, we will gather outside around the stone cross near Frankfort Avenue (weather permitting) to hear the reading of the Palm Sunday story of Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem and to bless and distribute the palms. We will then process together into church for the Eucharist during which the Passion Gospel will be read with persons from the congregation participating. There will be no church school classes on Palm Sunday.

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week are quiet days between the acclaim of Jesus on Palm Sunday and the immediate events leading up to his Crucifixion later in the week. On Wednesday evening we will observe a special liturgy. From the *Book of Occasional Services*, the service of Tenebrae will be prayed. The name "Tenebrae" (the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows") has for centuries been applied to the ancient monastic night and early morning services (Matins and Lauds) of the last three days of Holy Week, which in medieval times came to be celebrated on the preceding evenings. Apart from the chant of the Lamentations (in which each verse is introduced by a letter of the Hebrew alphabet), the most conspicuous feature of the service is the gradual extinguishing of candles and other lights in the church until only a single candle, considered a symbol of our Lord, remains. Toward the end of the service this candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil. At the very end, a loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of the resurrection (Matthew 28:2), the hidden candle is restored to its place, and by its light all depart in silence. Tenebrae is an extended meditation upon, and a prelude to, the events in our Lord's life between the Last Supper and the Resurrection.

Maundy Thursday, April 5, is the day of the Last Supper, Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist, and the time when

Jesus washed his disciples' feet. We will observe the full liturgy for the day with the Holy Eucharist at 6:30 p.m. in the midst of which the Foot-Washing will take place. Following the service we will have an Agape (Fellowship) Meal in commemoration of that last meal Jesus had with his disciples. The Agape meal is a quiet, simple supper. There will be special table prayers before eating and a Scripture reading and songs during the meal. We ask that interested parishioners sign up in the Information Center and that they also indicate their preference in bringing either unsliced bread, unsliced fruit (bananas, oranges, grapes or apples) or unsliced cheese. All donated items should be taken to the kitchen prior to the 6:30 p.m. service. Soup, wine and grape juice will be provided. The cost is \$4.00 per adult and \$2.00 per child.

The Maundy Thursday Service concludes with the Stripping of the Altar. This liturgical section commemorates the agony of Christ in the Garden. As Christ prepared for the crucifixion, we prepare the Sanctuary for Good Friday. The evening's activities will conclude at approximately 8:45 p.m. The children will have a special Agape supper (to be held after the 6:30 p.m. service) in the second-floor education center, followed by a Godly Play story and stripping of the Godly Play shelves.

Good Friday, April 6, is the day of the Crucifixion, and the Good Friday Liturgy from the Book of Common Prayer will be used at noon and 6:30 p.m. There will be a sermon and special music. In a particularly dramatic part of this liturgy a wooden cross is brought into the church, and while this cross is set before the congregation, we will have prayers and music commemorating the Crucifixion. In order to celebrate the joy of the Resurrection on Easter Day you will want to know the sorrow of the Crucifixion.

Holy Saturday will be marked at St. Mark's with another special liturgy. The liturgy is brief, but powerful. On Holy Saturday we observe the spiritual discipline of waiting. Good Friday is behind us. Easter has not yet come. We anticipate Easter. We mourn Good Friday. We wait. The liturgy of Holy Saturday marks and observes this special moment in our spiritual journeys.

After the great events of Holy Week, Easter Day, April 8, comes in all its beauty and joy, with a church massed with flowers, and there will be music and Scripture to lift the spirit with our yearly reminder that God is victorious. We will worship at our usual times of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. on Easter Sunday. (There will be no church school classes.) Children, please remember to bring a few flowers from your yard to make our bare wooden cross come alive with color on Easter Sunday.

Easter Flowers

The giving of an Easter flower recognizes and remembers loved ones or acknowledges blessings and also assists the Altar Guild in decorating our church for Easter. For your convenience order forms are available in the Information Center. Please note that the deadline for placing orders is Sunday, March 18. Orders should be turned into the parish office.

Easter Flower Delivery

Following Easter the flowers that adorned the church will be given to our parish ill and homebound. The plants can be delivered to our parishioners anytime the week after Easter, and assistance is needed with this special ministry. Senior Warden's Corner

I'd like to start my first Senior Warden note in the St. Marker by thanking the outgoing vestry members for a job well done, and by welcoming the new members. I know I have big shoes to fill following Lyle Spalding in this position. I think I speak for all of the vestry members when I say what an honor it is to be elected to serve on the vestry of such a wonderful congregation. At our annual meeting, we previewed the video put together by Carlile Crutcher and David Boone for those visiting our parish. A common thread ran through the statements made about St. Mark's by parishioners – welcoming, warm, friendly, a sense of community and family. But what gets people to take that first step inside our doors? Several years ago, the National Council of Churches conducted a study to answer just that question. They found that 3% just walk in, 6% come for the sermons, 5% because of Sunday school and 2% come for a specific need such as a marriage or to have a child baptized. But, overwhelmingly, the most common reason for people to visit a church (79%) is because someone invited them. I know that's how I became an Episcopalian – an invitation by the woman who would become my Godmother.

There are many people standing outside our doors who may desperately need a caring community. What a wonderful gift we have here at St. Mark's – a gift that's meant for sharing.

Cantate Domino

The Fauré Requiem will be sung by combined choirs of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church and St. Mark's on Sunday, March 18, at 11:00 a.m. at St. Andrew's and on Sunday, March 25, at 10:00 a.m. at St. Mark's, accompanied by the Highland Chamber players, harp, and organ.

The Latin Requiem text draws from the scriptures and the liturgy of the mass for the dead. In composing this beautiful work, however, Gabriel Fauré chose to use only selected parts of the Roman liturgy and burial service, concentrating more on faith in eternal life and rest, rather than on wrath and judgment. Thus, its musical tone is very positive, conveying peace, serenity, and victory. The Requiem was composed, in Fauré's words, "for the pleasure of it," rather than in memory of a specific person. He conducted the first performance January 16, 1888, in his own church, La Madeleine, in Paris. The occasion was the funeral of a church member. However, within less than a decade, Fauré's Requiem was enthusiastically accepted as concert music, as well as church music.

Parish Nursing Tips

Balance may be affected by medications or by chronic illnesses like joint disorders, alcoholism and diabetes; or neurological disorders like Parkinson's disease.

Weather factors this time of year don't make things any easier. A simple walk or climbing stairs can be more hazardous at certain times of day or in slushy conditions.

The following are tips to help avoid falls during the winter and throughout the year:

- Use night lights throughout the home.
- Secure loose rugs with non-slip strips.
- Move furniture and other objects to ensure clear walking paths indoors and out.
- Keep electrical and telephone cords out of foot traffic areas.
- Keep a telephone handy in case you need to call for help.
- Install grab bars near the toilet and inside the tub or shower.
- Get regular vision and hearing tests. Use glasses and hearing aids as your doctor recommends.
- Find out if your medications cause side effects that affect coordination or balance.
- Get up slowly after sitting, lying down or eating. Any quick movements may cause your blood pressure to drop and make you feel faint.
- Use a cane, walking stick or walker to help keep you balanced and steady.
- Make sure the soles of your shoes are rubber and low-heeled to help prevent slips and trips.
- Always hold the handrails when climbing up or down stairs.
- Take your time.
