United Crescent Hill Ministries Kicks Off New Era

UCHM celebrated its 30th anniversary on April 3, with the dedication of its new home, the United Crescent Hill Ministries Community Center, located in the former Franklin Elementary School building. An overflow crowd celebrated this new beginning with music performed by a community of church choirs and recognition of the generosity of scores of persons who invested their creativity, energy, money, and time in bringing this dream to reality. The breezy spring day contrasted starkly with April 3, 1974, the date of the massive tornado that hit Louisville and sparked the creation of UCHM, as area churches came together in response to the community's needs. William S. Butler celebrated the dedication by selling copies of his new book, *Tomado*, and donating half the proceeds of all books sold there to UCHM.

Immediately on the heels of the dedication, UCHM participated in the Frankfort Avenue Easter Parade. Participants escorted UCHM's van, decorated as a stylized bunny. For reasons no one can discern (aside from paraders' pelting the judges with tons of candy), UCHM was awarded the Bunny Bribery award.
