## Summer Worship Schedule

Beginning Sunday, June 5, and continuing through Sunday, August 28, St. Mark's will be offering a casual and informal worship service on Sunday evenings at 5:30 p.m. The service is meant for all who are out of town for most of the weekend or whose summer activities make worship at one of our other services difficult. The service will be Holy Eucharist, Rite Two. You should come dressed casually (even the clergy do not vest at this service). We do very little planning for the service, preferring to organize ourselves immediately prior to worship with some of those present volunteering to take different leadership roles. There is no childcare for this service because we want the children to worship with us--this is a very child-friendly worship experience. St. Mark's will, of course, continue to offer our three permanent worship services: Saturday 5:30 p.m. and Sunday at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.
