Outreach

St. Mark's has an active and growing engagement with Kentucky Refugee Ministries and various programs provided to refugees being resettled in Louisville. At the present time an emphasis is on providing help to Karen refugees (Burma) arriving in the US after living many years in settlement camps. Outreach Ministry has posted an article on the bulletin boards about the work Resurrection Episcopal parish is doing for their Karen. We invite you to read the material. Resurrection would appreciate any help St. Mark's can add to their efforts.

This month we want to feature some of the many opportunities to volunteer at Kentucky Refugee Ministries. Louisville has become home for many refugee families, and KRM is the critical entry point for these families. - **THE GREATEST NEED - FAMILY LIFE CENTER:** Looking for volunteers who enjoy working with refugee toddlers and their mothers at the Family Life Center located at Highland Baptist Church on the corner of Cherokee and Grinstead. The Center is dedicated to providing English classes for Mothers who will not be working due to the young age of their children. Volunteers assist teachers in the children's classrooms or supervise babies in the nursery. Volunteers working with ESL classes would teach English/civics lessons to small groups of refugee women and assist the ESL teacher. The Center is open Mon., Tues., and Thurs. 9am – 12:30pm.
- **ELDERLY PROGRAM MENTORS/TUTORS:** This program assists refugees in improving English to prepare them for the citizenship test, to enable them to access services in Louisville, and to help them with socialization. The program meets Wed. and Friday from 10 to noon at Gateway Community Church located at 4623 Southern Parkway.
- **SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM: ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE CLASSROOM AIDES, THREE NEEDED EACH DAY; 9:30 – 12:30 everyday; BIG BOOK VOLUNTEERS** three days each week, to read Big Books to elementary – high school students; and **FIELD TRIP CHAPERONES**, needed every Wednesday to help with supervising refugee students on field trips.

- **CITIZENSHIP TUTOR:** Volunteers needed to meet with refugees who are eligible for citizenship, one hour per week or during the citizenship classes (two hours). Volunteers are paired with students in KRM's citizenship classes to study materials for the exam, conduct mock citizenship interviews, and to practice speaking English.
- **DONATIONS ORGANIZER:** Volunteers to come in bi-weekly or monthly for two to three hours to help sort and organize donations given for refugee resettlement. Donations include clothing and household items, school supplies, toys, uniforms, etc. This task is more independent as volunteers are able to decide how best to organize contributions as they come in.

The Assistant Rector's Reflections on the Psalms

One of my favorite spiritual practices is *lectio divina* or "divine reading" of the Scriptures. In doing *lectio divina*, one picks out from a scripture passage a phrase that speaks to one's heart and then meditates on that phrase. Often that meditation turns into a prayer. In the St. Marker this year, I would like to share some of the prayers and meditations that have resulted from my practice of *lectio divina*. Meditation on Psalm 62:5

"For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him."

The ancient stones huddle together on a hilltop, waiting in the rain and wind, waiting for God to come. The tops of mountains loom above, prepared for the divine command to fall; but they have not fallen. Strong yet lonely walls recall a fortress, but inside, silence fills the empty spaces of a church, a church no longer impatient in its waiting. Heavy, echoing silence flows like water over the stones. Voices would only shatter in such a stillness, in a darkness coated with the pleading odor of a thousand years of candle flames. Hope flickers in some floating dust, and honorable intentions hide in the ceiling corners. Time has rubbed away the clever artistry of decoration, and the stones' nakedness offers up trust and vulnerability. All-knowing and ponderous voices have fled into the wind, and only stubborn questions still lurk under flagstones. The ancient church, like my soul, for God alone in silence waits. O God, our hope is in our waiting.
