## The Assistant Rector's Reflections on the Psalms

### Meditation on Psalm 81:8, 10, 16

O Israel, if you would but listen to me! ... I am the Lord your God, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide and I will fill it. . . . I would feed you with the finest of the wheat, and with honey from the rock I would satisfy you.

When I see the soft, once-laughing, baby-eyes of my son creased under wary lids of hurt, my heart sinks like lead. When I see the hands that joyfully built towers of blocks, now deftly building invisible walls to hide behind, my own loud protest pierces my soul. When I see my daughter's strong neck bowed under unnecessary loads, I want to lift them from her, but they turn to mist in my hands. When I see a longing in her face that will forever go unmet in the piles of things that she so carefully gathers about her, I beg her to listen in words that she cannot hear. As the heart of a mother bleeds tenderly for her children, O God, how you must weep over creation. How you must suffer when your children cannot hear your loving voice, instead clutching pain resolutely to their breasts. How can you stand to watch

us scrounge for dry, pitiful crusts of bread while we could be spoon-fed with the sweetness of wild honey? Love, when poured into the stubborn molds of this world, seems to become a helpless, hidden thing. But you, Creator and Sustainer God, wait patiently in the shadows, always ready to slip a quiet hand beneath a burden or to whisper “I love you” while we sleep.

## Congratulations

Our parishioners, David Arnold and David McDaniel, were married in California in October 2008. The Reverend Rosa Lee Harden, Episcopal priest in the Diocese of California, officiated at the ceremony which was held at Holy Innocents Episcopal Church where she serves as vicar. David and David were one of 18,000 same-gender couples who were married in California after the State Supreme Court ruled same-gender marriages legal in the state. A referendum in November, however, defined marriage as a heterosexual institution, and their October marriage was thus called into question. In late May, the California Supreme Court upheld the legal validity of the same-gender marriages conducted in the state prior to the referendum.

We congratulate David and David on their marriage. Stating that "We have everything we need and most of what we want", the couple requested that any gifts be directed as contributions to United Crescent Hill Ministries where David Arnold has served on the board.

David Arnold recently received the much coveted "Unsung Hero" award at St. Mark's for his work on the renovation of Langley Hall. David McDaniel sings in the choir at the principal worship service on Sundays. They contribute much to our common life, and we are grateful that they have made St. Mark's their parish.
