Our Congregational Timeline

Education for Ministry

St. Mark's is interested in hosting two Education for Ministry (EfM) classes during the 2009-2010 academic year. The Education for Ministry program, a distance learning program of the School of Theology of the University of the South, is one of the best adult education programs available to Episcopalians, providing lay people with the basis of a theological education and developing knowledge and confidence about the Christian ministry that we all share.

There will be a Thursday evening group, mentored by the Rev. Dr. Charles Hawkins, that will meet from 6:00 pm until 8:30 pm. We are also offering a Wednesday morning group, mentored by St. Mark's parishioner, Dr. Elizabeth Mitchell, that will meet from 10 am until 12:30 pm. Both groups will begin meeting in September, after Labor Day.

This gathering of AA is one of the largest and most long-standing in our community. St. Mark's would like to continue and expand our ministry to Resurrection parish in its service to their growing number of Karen (Burmese) refugee members. We have provided Prayer Books and Hymnals written in the Karen language. We will continue tutoring Karen students in the fall, when tutoring classes begin again at Crescent Hill Baptist Church. The Brotherhood of St. Andrew at St. Mark's is trying to help provide transportation for the Karen to church on Sundays. The Assistant Rector's Reflections on the Psalms

Meditation on Psalm 18

"The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer, my God, my rock in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold ... They confronted me in the day of my calamity; but the Lord was my support. He brought me out into a broad place; he delivered me, because he delighted in me."

When I hear that you are my refuge, O God, I run as fast as I can to shut myself away behind your doors of holy steel. When I hear that you are my rock, I start to burrow beneath the immutable granite of your face, desperately digging a cave for myself there, a lonely, hidden home. When I hear that you are my crag and my stronghold, my soul looks up with wistful eyes, ready to watch the world's turmoil from lofty, dizzying heights. Impatiently I call upon you, O God, and faithfully you answer. But you do not invite me into the calm and shielding arms of my dreams. Instead, you come in a thundercloud, in a whirlwind of blinding incomprehensibility, and you grasp me fiercely and shake me loose from my hiding places. Yes, you rescue me, but not from any of the enemies that I had feared. You tear me free from my masks and my self-deceptions, and you set me down in an open place, in a field where the light is clear, and the air is fresh, and I am utterly exposed for who I am. As I gather the shredded garments of my dignity around my battered frame, I realize that the miracle was not in my rescue but in my exposure. You did not save me so that I could make myself invisible in you; you saved me because you delighted in me, because you rejoiced in the essence of my pure, bare, vulnerable soul, open like a book in your presence.
