Update on the St. Mark's Timeline

The Assistant Rector's Reflections on the Psalms

Every Member Canvass

Each fall the Vestry must create a budget for the following year. As part of that effort, St. Mark's collects pledges from parishioners so that the Vestry can plan accordingly.

At the time this month's St. Mark's went to press 44 pledges had been received for 2010. To date, the total amount pledged \$127,308.00.

In 2008, the parish had 119 pledges which totaled \$361,255.40. In 2009, the parish had 118 pledges for a total of \$310,823.38.
